Leaves Everywhere

Fall is a wonderful time of year for many reasons, weather begins to cool down, kids are back in school, and leaves begin to change color producing a breath taking view as you drive down the road. People begin to think, "man this is perfect". Then they drive into their property and see leaves everywhere. What are the landscapers doing? Did they remove any leaves at all? What do they do with all the leaves? Have they even been here today?

Each visit the crew will blow the leaves into piles and remove each one with the crew or, on larger properties, we will send our leaf truck to pick them up.



At the end of the leaf season all leaves are removed so the property is set for the winter.

We take the leaves back to our yard and add to our compost pile, recycling the leaves into valuable compost to be put back into the soil. Also your Greenwood Group Account Manager inspects each property to double check the crew is performing in a way our clients have grown to expect from us.

Fall Caramel Apple Pie

Crust:

2 Cups all-purpose flour OR Ready made piecrust
½ teaspoon salt
2/3 cup shortening
6-tablespoon ice cold water

Apple Filling:

6 to 8 apples, peeled and sliced, about 5 cups
Lemon juice
1-cup sugar
6 tablespoons all-purpose flour
½ teaspoon ground cinnamon

Topping:

2/3 cup crushed cinnamon graham crackers
¼ cup packed brown sugar
3-tablespoon all-purpose flour
1/3-cup butter

Egg Wash:

1 egg, beaten with 1-tablespoon water

Garnish:

Scoop of ice cream
Caramel sauce

Crust:

Mix Flour and salt. Cut in shortening until mixture resembles coarse ground cornmeal. Add water 1 tablespoon at a time. OR USE READY MADE CRUST

Roll out 2/3 of dough for bottom crust or use one sheet of the ready make crust and place into pie pan. Roll out last 1/3 of dough (OR 2nd sheet of pre-made crust) and cut into strips for lattice top crust. On parchment paper or cookie sheet, weave the strips to form lattice. Set aside.

For Topping: mix cracker crumbs, brown sugar and flour. Cut in butter until crumbly. Set aside.

For filling: combine apples, lemon juice, sugar, flour, and cinnamon. Spoon apple filling into crust.

Sprinkle cracker topping over apples.

Slide lattice crust over top of pie. Fold edges of bottom crust over ends of lattice crust, pressing to seal. Brush lattice strips with egg wash

Fold foil strips around edges of crust and bake for 15 minutes. Remove foil and continue baking for an additional 40 minutes or until apples are bubbling and crust is browned. While still hot, drizzle pie with caramel sauce and scoop ice cream.

Helpful Tips for Homeowners

At last the long hot summer is beginning to transition into fall and I for one could not be happier. There are a lot of landscape items that need to be addressed over the next few months. The following are just a few.

- This is the "best" time to plant trees and shrubs. Be certain to dig your hole three times as wide as the root ball. Also, make sure to dig the hole no deeper than the depth of the root ball.
- Most Bermuda lawns will benefit from a "winterizer" when growth has slowed but before dormancy.
- Prepare fescue lawns for over seeding. Get rid of unwanted grasses and weeds with round up. After the weeds have died, then aerate and over seed with fescue seed.
- Be sure and apply fall pre emergent to warm season lawns to reduce the amount of weeds in your turf come spring time.
- Now is a great time to divide ground covers such as daylilies and monkey grass.
- October the 15th is a good benchmark for the beginning of fall flower planting.
- Late October is a great time to plant your spring flowering bulbs.

Fescue Turf in the Fall

Over-seeding Fescue is one of the yearly tasks that must be done in Georgia to keep the grass lush and thick. Below are successful steps in getting your fescue lawn on the right track:

1. In mid September spray for any weeds in your lawn.
2. The first week of October, mow your lawn down to the height of 1- 2 inches.
3. If you have a sprinkler system, it would be wise to turn on the system and mark all the heads at this time.
4. Aerate, seed and fertilize your lawn right after you mow. Make sure you have good seed to soil contact.
5. Run irrigation or set up sprinklers to water in the seed and soil. This is one of the most crucial steps.
6. Water the lawn 2 times daily for 12 days. We only recommend enough water to keep the soil moist. If the seed dries out, it may die. Once the seed is up and growing, you can reduce water usage.
7. Allow 14-20 days after seeding to mow again. The mowing will damage the new seed if you choose to mow too soon.
8. Apply more fertilizer 6 weeks after aerating.

People often ask us about Bermuda encroachment in the Fescue. September is a good time to apply round up to the areas with Bermuda infestation. We recommend spraying the Bermuda areas twice to get good results. Once the Bermuda is dead, you can scalp these areas when you mow your lawn in step #2.
